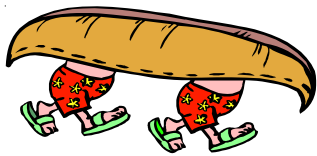
○ On Monday morning, the battle for the banner color continued with Red/Gray Hoops and Kayaking in the morning. In a display of outstanding defense on the basketball court, the Reds emerged victorious with a 31-22 score. Down on the shores, Red kayakers rolled, flipped, and rescued their way to a 54-45 victory over the Grays.



Monday afternoon saw the Grays rebound from close losses to win Red/Gray Riding at the farmhouse. After trotting and cantering under the hot afternoon sun, the Grays pulled out a victory over the Reds by the slimmest of margins. Winning 138-137, they proved they were still in the fight.



The fields were dry and ready for Tuesday morning's Red/Gray Lacrosse match. Though we had some very warm sunshine, the heat did not slow down the Reds as they rolled to an 11-1 victory over the Grays. Though they could have given up and admitted defeat, the Grays held their heads high, scored a goal, and played hard until the very end. Both sides displayed the winning Winona spirit we are so proud to brag of after contests!



Tuesday afternoon was all about Red/Gray Canoe and Biathlon. Canoeist paddled their way around Moose Pond flaunting their paddling skills. In the end, Reds were victorious but all celebrated with a dip in the superbly refreshing waters off of our H-dock. The Biathlon had runners trying to control their heart rates. Four runners from each team had to do a loop around camp and then shoot at five targets on the rifle range while standing. Grays proved to have the steadier hands and hearts by winning the competition in 66:38 to the Reds 80:31.





Wednesday morning was Red/Gray Arts and Crafts. The Reds proved they had more artistic ability but the Grays were not deterred. Wednesday afternoon, both Reds and Grays took to the tennis courts and



battled it out in the sun. Though the Reds won both singles matches, they could not defeat the Grays in three doubles matches. The Grays won tennis 3-2. In a surprise event, Reds and Grays had Camper/Counselor Hunt after the tennis match. Pitting age and experience against youth and vigor, the counselors challenged the campers to a good 'ole fashion game of Hide 'n Seek. Many counselors were found and some were worth more points than others. In the end, the Reds accumulated more counselors that were worth more points and pulled out the victory.



Moose Pond waters were churned to a froth inside the H-dock on Thursday morning as Red/Gray swimming got underway. Campers swam a freestyle relay, medley relay, and individual races including the back stroke, fly, and breast stroke. Determined not to let the Reds run away with the banner, the Grays battled their way back into contention with a 70-10 victory in swimming. The Grays nearly swept the entire competition until the last race.



Also on Thursday morning, Red/Gray Rock Climbing commenced. Challenging gravity and their vertical limits, Inty campers battled it out on the climbing wall. Several climbers were able to flash climb (climbing to the top without falling once) to gain extra points. In the end, the Grays dominated the Reds to the tune of 2,192 – 1,313.



The marathon of Red/Gray skirmishes continued on Thursday afternoon in Archery and Sailing. On the range, four Reds clashed with four Grays in an extreme show of marksmanship. One arrow made the difference after 8 archer's shot 3 arrows through 10 rounds. With an extraordinarily close score of 1,062 – 1,059 the Grays squeaked out another



close victory. The sailors of Intermediate followed suit as if it were scripted. With only a slight wind on the water, the mariners of Moose Pond had to rely on their skills more than Mother Nature. In another nail biting finale, the Reds pulled out the win with a 31-30 victory over the Grays.



To top off another spectacular day of Red/Gray competition, Inty campers were ecstatic to have Air Band for Evening Program. This was not a Red/Gray event but a tribal contest. Delawares, Mohawks, Senecas, and Ojibways each chose two songs to lip synch. They got in to some pretty elaborate costumes and let a ton of stress from competition out on stage as they danced and sang the night away. Top honors went to the Delawares (30 pts.) followed by the Ojibways (20 pts.), then the Mohawks (10 pts.) and Senecas (5 pts.). To close out the evening a dance party was enjoyed by all before hitting the sack for some hard earned rest for Friday's events.



Red/Gray Baseball was the sole event on Friday morning. Yet another superbly competitive game was played by campers. In the first inning, the Grays went ahead 2-0 and it stayed that way until the final inning. At the top of the inning, the Reds scored two runs to tie it at 2-2. With two outs, the Grays were making it look like it would go to extra innings. But a beautifully placed bunt and two throwing errors allowed the Grays to score the walk off winning run and win the game 3-2. Both teams played extremely well and practiced great sportsmanship.

The afternoon on Friday came with lots of excitement as Red/Gray Treasure Hunt was the activity many campers and counselors look forward to all summer long. Six groups of campers & counselors race around camp property deciphering clues to their next destination. The team finishing first in each group wins points for their team. Both mentally and physically challenging for every camper in the unit this event ended with soda and lodge for everybody. Final results: Red A (30 pts.), Gray B (20 pts.), and Gray C (20 pts.).



Saturday morning saw the last of the Red/Gray competitions as campers took to the pitch on the upper athletic field for a soccer contest. Once again, an evenly contested match ensued as both teams handled the ball extremely well and moved it up and down the field for numerous scoring chances. Not many chances went in the goal though. The score at half time was 1-0 due to a penalty shot. The second half saw the Grays capitalize on two opportunities along with some staunch defense. The end result was a 2-1 victory over the Reds.



During the afternoon, the entire unit engaged in a battle of skill once again as every activity was completed by campers in The Great Relay. From archery to rock climbing, campers ran swiftly to and from each event passing along the baton, cheering for teammates to succeed. The Grays started with the lead and the Reds caught up to them several times; once at Sloyd, in Sailing, and again in Baggo. However, each time the Grays were able to muster some extra

energy and pull ahead again. At the final event, campers had to boil water using a billet soaked in water for five minutes. After axe splitting, contact splitting, and shaving the wood, they built



a cabin to start a fire. Grays had too much of a head start for the Reds to catch them. The Grays finished the relay with a time of 2 hours and 26 minutes. The Reds finished the relay with a time of 2 hours and 38 minutes. Victory and defeat were both short lived as Senior Circus began immediately following the race and lasted into the evening, followed by a free swim time before lights out.
